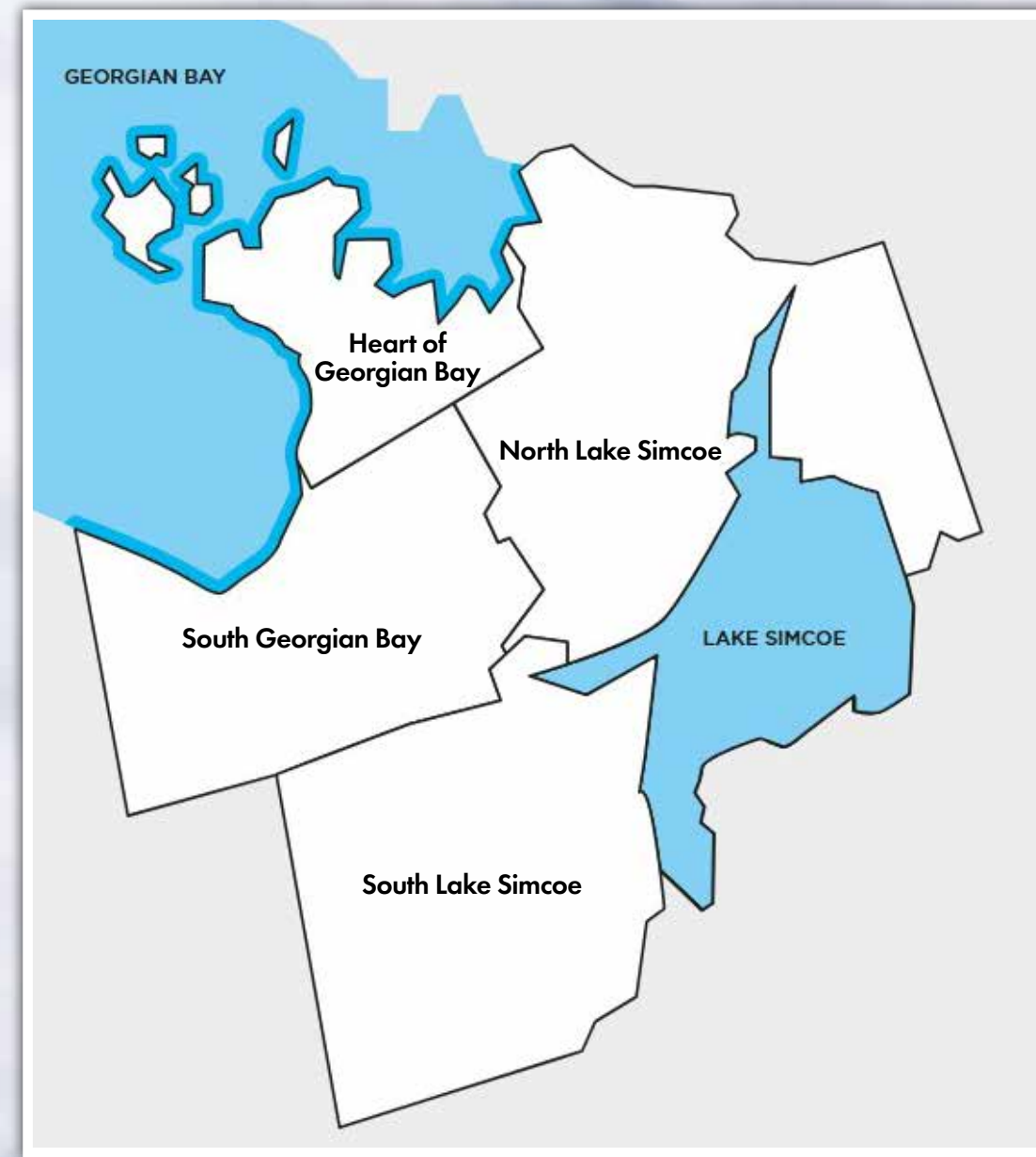

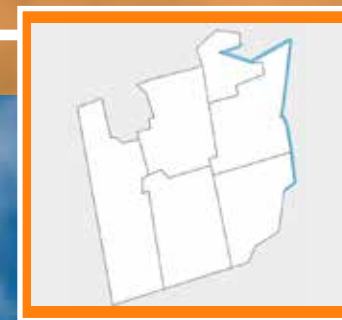

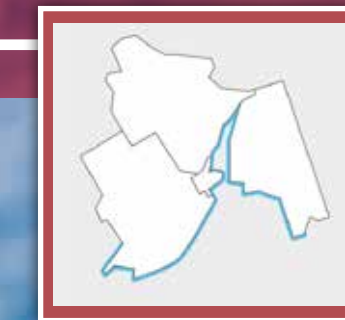

### Outdoor

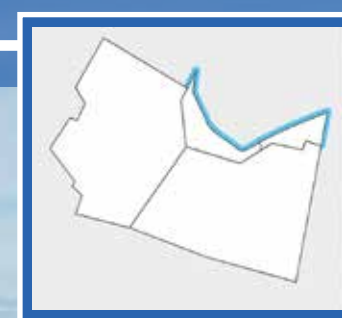

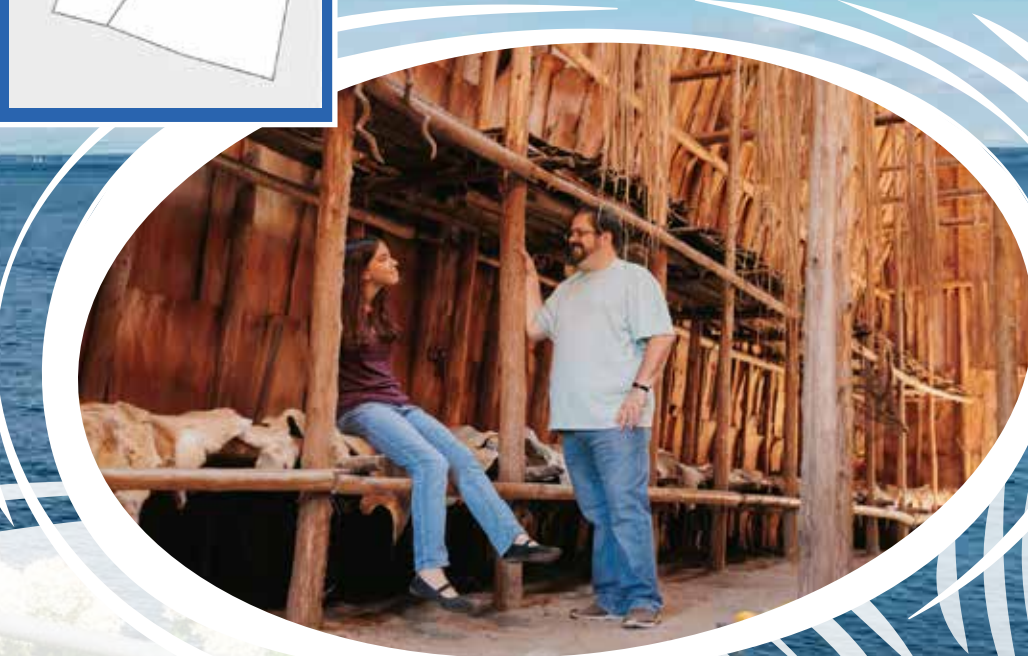

**Simcoe County Loop Trail**  
 160 KM | OFF ROAD/RAIL TRAIL | FLAT/EASY  
 The Simcoe County Loop Trail is a 160-kilometre loop that travels through nine municipalities and reaches three major bodies of water, including Georgian Bay, Lake Simcoe, and Lake Couchiching. The Simcoe County Loop Trail is primarily on off-road, multi-use rail trails. The route is flat, scenic and available as a multi-day tour.
